The above Subject item has been investigated, and the findings are listed as follows:

BACKGROUND

The Planning Commission reviewed on February 12, 2020 the request by the City Manager to rezone the land of the below listed parcels which comprise The Washington Park Cemetery. St Louis County Recorder of Deeds contacted the City of Berkeley and requested that the City take ownership of the property and create park land, and maintain the cemetery due to tax delinquency and to protect it from commercial development.

The city has applied for ownership and will maintain the land as park land in perpetuity therefore, the request to rezone from M-1 to P-1 is being submitted.

The site has four (4) parcels:

City Recovery from St. Louis County:

4522 James S. McDonnell - (11.98 acres) taxes due \$45,052.53.

4560 James S. McDonnell - (26.83 acres) - taxes due \$366,437.08

Independently Owned parcels:

4524 James S. McDonnell – (0.04 acres) American Tower holds a lease and taxes are paid in full on this portion – takes paid

4744 James S. McDonnell – (2.86 acres) owned by DDI Media a 100' ft. of land for Bulletin Board Advertising – taxes paid

JUSTIFICATION

"M-1" zoning requirements:

• Front yard: Twenty-five (30) feet

• Side yard: Fifteen (15) feet

• Rear yard: Twenty-five (25) feet

- 1. Hours of operations shall be from sunrise to sunset., seven days a week.
- 2. The building, lot, landscaping, and yard areas shall be maintained and kept free and clear of any debris or trash or weeds including maintenance of all landscaped areas.
- 3. No new burials will be allowed
- 4. Buildings and site conditions in need of repair shall be repaired or replaced per the approval of the Building Commissioner.

SUMMARY AND DECISION

The City Council members can modify or add any other conditions with their approval recommendations for this rezoning.

PUBLIC NOTICE AND COMMENT

Public Hearing notification is applicable. Upon recommendation by City Plan Commission to City Council, notices shall be mailed to owners and occupants of the property within 185 feet of the site. This public hearing shall be published, posted and scheduled for March 2, 2020.
