SUBJECT: An Ordinance awarding bids for two (2) City-owned properties from the City of Berkeley Dollar Home Program.

BACKGROUND

The Dollar Home Program is established to allow the City to purchase sub-standard housing units and offer them for sale in the City at a depressed market price. The purpose of this program is to rehabilitate sub-standard housing units which are having an adverse impact upon our residential neighborhoods and to re-sell the units to owner-occupants providing an increase in new affordable housing stock that will address the housing and neighborhood stabilization recommendation of the comprehensive plan. In 2019 the City approved using Economic Development Sales Tax funds for acquisition of several properties, which the City proceeded to do, and in March of 2023 the City put these properties out for Bid. Through the previous rounds of the Dollar Home Program we have awarded 22 properties.

Bids were received for multiple properties, which were then screened on several criteria: rental license current, proof of funding, taxes paid, any outstanding violations, city resident, bids/estimates of cost submitted, and copy of valid ID. At the same time Staff approached neighbors to each of these properties who we identified as owner occupants, and asked if they were interested in these properties (*as part of the rules of the program, neighbors get first chance to acquire these properties*). Two applicants fulfilled the requirements of the program and are purchasing 6830 Woodhurst to fix it up and rent it out, and the vacant lot at 6809 Frostview.

IMPACT ON BUDGET

The impact will be positive, as this property will go back on the tax rolls with increased property value, and they will improve the property value of their neighbors.
