- **WHEREAS,** the City of Berkeley recognizes that land use policies have a major impact on whether people and property are exposed to natural hazards, the City of Berkeley will endeavor to integrate the Plan into the comprehensive planning process; and
- **WHEREAS,** adoption by the City of Berkeley demonstrates their commitment to hazard mitigation and achieving the goals outlined in the Plan.

THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF BERKELEY, MISSOURI AS FOLLOWS:

- **Section 1.** The Mayor and City Council for the City of Berkeley do hereby adopt the final FEMA approved plan.
- **Section 2.** This Resolution shall be in full force and effect from and after the date of its passage.

Subject: Approval of St. Louis Regional Hazard Mitigation Plan

BACKGROUND

The St. Louis Region through East-West Gateway Council of Governments develops and approves a regional hazard mitigation plan every five years. The purpose is twofold: 1) to develop regional implementation strategies in the event of a natural disaster and 2) as an eligibility requirement to apply for hazard mitigation funding from FEMA.

Although the City approved an earlier version of the 2020-2025 plan on September 16, 2019 (Resolution #3485), we are still obligated to reapprove the Plan every five years in order to maintain our eligibility.
